# The Ruffian on the Stair, by Joe Orton **Burton Taylor Theatre until Saturday 3rd**

- a goldfish inside a condom? The same goldfish lies suspiciously still in his bowl for most of this short one scene play. But it's about the only thing that does stay still. Joe Orton's first play, written in 1963, revolves around the squalid lives of Mike (Mike Lovatt), Joyce, his live-in girlfriend ((Katherine Rushton), and 'the Ruffian', Wilson (Rob Riddell). Being Orton's first play, and least well known, it could be seen as a breeding

ground for the later blackly satirical writing which was to earn him the title of "the Oscar Wilde of welfare state gentry". Not quite so startling as his other work, but not without some little shining gems

(the opening line being a good example: "I'm to be at King's Cross station at eleven. I'm meeting a man in the toilets"). Despite all its clever talk, the play is basically about the fear of solitude and rejection amidst the everyday activities of sexual indecency and murder.

by the very empathically played Joyce. Joyce is an ex-prostitute who veers from intense bravery to scary levels of stupidity, and who, despite the very male focus of the play actually utters the majórity of the hilarious lines. Mr. Lovatt and Mr. Riddell seemed slightly less able than Ms. Rushton to ignore the raucous audience, but then we were virtually sitting on their knees in the tiny arena. Orton wrote of *The Ruffian* that all pauses should be natural and that "pace, pace, pace" was important. At times, the pace was slightly too slow, but when it picked up there was many a brilliant comical moment. The music, written for the play by Dominic de Cogan, was suitably lively and initially captured the clown-like quality

Apparently the set should "produce a feeling of familiarity – yet with an odd dislocation". I don't know if it was the set so much, but I certainly left the theatre not knowing whether I actually found *The Ruffian* amusing or tragic, or whether I felt pity or anger towards the characters. Pretty good work for the production of a play written by an "enemy of order". And you'll have to see what happens to the goldfish at the end... $^{\circ}$



# The Pirates by Gilbert and Sullivan of Penzance

When The Pirates of Penzance first went before London audiences in 1880, it proved so popular that it indirectly caused a public order problem. Enthusiasm for Gilbert & Sullivan's operettas reached such a height during its run that when their next piece, Patience, was premièred,

fighting broke out in the streets amongst those anxious to secure the last few tickets. Those waiting outside St John's College Auditorium last night managed, by and large, to keep their fists to themselves. But the OU Gilbert & Sullivan Society's opening performance of *Pirates* was all but sold out, a measure of the continuing popularity this famous opera, and of the hype which this first-rate production has generated. As something of a  $ilde{G}$  & S novice, I approached Tuesday


night's excursion into the heart of Victorian light opera with some trepidation. But from the opening bars these fears were proven to be ill-founded The dash, verve and sheer joie de vivre of the cast delighted the capacity audience, as did the



cheerful professionalism of the orchestra. The director, Charlie Wilson, fairly back-to-basics

of the Pirate band. But perhaps the most impressive performance came from Matthew Rogers as the Pirate King. Rising above the bubble perm wig, he gave his portrayal of this charming blackguard a knowing swagger, while hinting at the lost orphan within. This was a truly dexterous display of stagecraft, with fine characterisation and even better singing. I also particularly enjoyed Jonathan Morgan as the Major-General, who attacked the role with infectious humour and vigour.



Gilbert & Sullivan's swashbuckling tale of the famous Pirates, their unwilling apprentice (a slave of duty) the Major-General and his daughters is told with such grace and sly humour that it does not show its 121 years. A final mention is due to the good people of the St John's Wine Tasting Society who, upon being mistaken for an interval oasis, proved accommodating beyond the call of duty One among them bade us point out what a generally splendid place St John's is for supporting such events, and it would be churlish to refuse.

# Three Days of Rain, by Richard Greenberg

Burton Taylor Theatre until Sat 3rd Katrina Manson's production of Richard

Greenberg's Three Days of Rain, which premiered in the Burton Taylor Theatre on Tuesday night, is a really good piece of directing and acting. The 1997 play tells the story of a triangular relationship in two generations. In the first act, set in the nineties, the neurotic, self-absorbed Walker and his sister Nan meet after the death of their father, a famous architect. The place: the old studio-flat of their father [just a lucky hint of a decoration, the BT is this attic]. Walker feels sure he will inherit the masterpiece of his father's oeuvre, the house. Yet instead of the rightful heirs, Pip, the son of their father's partner, inherits it. In addition to this mortification, Walker must learn that Pip and Nan had a liaison they kept secret from him. Humiliated, he searches his father's journal for an explanation and succeeds: Pip's father, it seems, was the real designer of the house. Cut...

he needs to start designing his house.
