The Rose and Crown. North Parade

The Rose & Crown on North Parade is one of Oxford's cosiest pubs. With two small inside rooms with fireplaces (and one corridor with seats), the overflow into its lovely patio garden (with retractable roof for all weathers) is a necessary delight. The tables outside are well heated (far warmer than those in the unroofed garden of the Turf Tavern) and can be occupied in even the coldest weather. The pub also has a piano and

several board games, though it wouldn't be wise to tap on the ivories without consulting the governor. At the back of the garden another room can be booked free of charge for parties or watching sporting events. On most nights of the week the pub fills with locals and students, and it can be hard to get a good seat if you don't get there early.

The bar's selection of lagers and ales is quite limited, but well selected, to a few kinds of Adnams, Old Hooky (recommended), Guinness (cold or regular), Stella and a few others. You have the option of straight glass or handled mug - said to keep the temperature of the beer from getting warmed by your hands. There is quite a reasonable selection of bottled beers, non-alcoholic drinks such as 12O and soft drinks, and liqueurs to choose from. They serve wine by the glass and the bottle, and the selection changes seasonally. The bar serve pistachios by the pint and has traditional pub snacks from pickled eggs to pork scratchings.

The menu is vegetarian- and vegan-friendly, as it is one of the few pubs in Oxford to offers a wide selection of salads, including Greek, Nicoise and mixed greens. They also offer falafel and humms, tzatziki, and taramasalata. They serve baguettes for lunch with an entire page of fillings including brie, stilton, chicken, ham, beef, peanut butter, fruit and vegetables.

honey glazed chicken breast, traditional sausage and mash (the sausage flavors change daily to weekly, and the serving is gigantic), gammon steak (which I've never tried, but looks dodgy), and rump steak (also never tried, but looks delicious). They have daily specials and traditional roasts on Sunday afternoons with Yorkshire pudding and dessert. For fish lowers they serve grilled trout, and they also do a poppy seed bagel with salmon and cream cheese.

The service depends on how busy it is — you order and pay at the bar, and the staff bring your food to the table, along with freshly ground pepper and a selection of mustards for meats. Prices are average (£4-£9 for a meal and the upper end of beer prices), and the ambience is exceptional.

KINSEY (15)

For his last film, Gods and Monsters, director Bill



celebrity for all the wrong reasons.

Dr. Alfred C. Rinsey, or Prok to his friends, is frequently held responsible for single-handedly kick-starting the sexual revolution which gripped the western world from the euphoric post-war years until the outbreak of AIDS. Revered and reviled in equal measure, Kinsey's lasting contribution to large-scale promiscuity amounted to little more than two scientific surveys of human sexual behaviour, on gall wasps, to the publication of his groundbreaking Sexual Behaviour of the Human Male, Kinsey, played beautifully by Liam Nesson, is portrayed as an obsessive, prosaic academic whose interest in sex comprises a titanic struggle between science and emotion. What begins as a scientific triumph ultimately pushes him to the brink of destruction, his work grossly misunderstood not only by the public but also by Kinsey himself.

A low-key film with no delusions of box-office grandeur, Kinsey nonetheless resorts on occasi A low-key film with no defusions of box-office grandeur, Kinsey nonetheless resorts on occasion to familiar mainstream conventions, as though uncertain of its cinematic menis. That it tries too hard to please is perhaps rather ironic, given the subject matter. The acting, however, is impeccable throughout while the script manages to be both deeply touching and genuinely amusing. A film about the science of sex is always going to benefit from a good helping of comedy, and Condon moves effortlessly between light and shade, blending serious biography with laugh-out-loud scenes without compromising the ultimately serious intent. A heavyweight supporting cast, including Chris O'Donnel, Laura Linney and John Liftgow, make light work of the often demanding material, allowing Kinsey to develop into that rarest of things; an informative and educational film which is actually a olessure to sit through.

actually a pleasure to sit through. For anyone with an interest in the major cultural upheavals of the twentieth century, and in particular the shy, sexually repressed man who awoke the world to its primal desires, the film is a must-see. But be warmed – some of the content is not for the easily offended. And all the better for it, I'd say,
