**FILM REVIEW**

**BLACK SWAN**

*Black Swan [15] at the Odeon George Street and at the Vue Cinema: see CINEMA, left, for showing times*

I left Black Swan shaking, and it wasn't with pleasure. This film grabs you by throat and leaves you gasping so hard that you need treatment. Urgently. My treatment comprised a cup of tea and a cupcake at the Jericho Cafe. It took a while to work...

The whole film is one long balletic steamroller. Everything is out of balance, from the very start, and the viewer is flung from one intense moment to the next throughout. Nina Sayers (Natalie Portman) is a young dancer who lives, breathes and self-harms ballet. When she's not pirouetting, she's living with her claustrophobic and unfulfilled mother in a cramped and fussy New York apartment. We are made aware of Nina's mental fragility from the start and, once we see her mother's frankly poor paintings becoming animated, we know we're heading for psychosis quicker than you can say tutu.

*Black Swan* does nothing for the image of ballet, but it certainly packs a powerful punch. See it and expect your emotions to be put on the rack. Mine were, and I don't expect to have such an intense cinematic experience for some time to come.

What was expecting a rather silly film drawing together all the common clichés and misconceptions of ballet, enhanced by some beautiful dance footage. What I got was almost the inverse - a much better storyline and disappointingly little ballet.

The lack of real ballet footage is, I suppose, inevitable if you're shooting a mixture of actors and professional dancers. But there is a great deal of cutting between views from the waist up of Portman's lovely face (usually sobbing) and views from the waist down of professionally muscled legs. And never the twain shall meet. Having said that, I thought the actors danced pretty well, given away more by muscle structure than false attitudes.

What was really disappointing was the handheld camera-work. This was positively sickening, in all senses, and where we could have seen some stupendous dancing shot from the wings, we mostly got wobbly footwork, swirling to and fro. I didn't feel it worked even to heighten tension; being unwatchable and annoying.

The best bit is the plot, and ballet is well-chosen as its backdrop, not just tacked on. It's a story of women (also a refreshing change from most Hollywood fare) and relationships teetering on the thin line between supportive to claustrophobic.

Female success - the pressure from ourselves and others to get there, the guilt of making it when others don't - you only have to read the papers to see how ambivalent society still is about women and ambition. This film may be a rather OTT way to explore all that, but it's pretty compelling.
