I wasted far too much time this winter watching Olympic Ice Dance on TV, yet I still wasn't prepared for the excitement of seeing top skaters perform a triple axle a few metres from my face. The Russian Ice Stars performing in last night's Snow White were almost technically faultless and the choreography was full of thrilling jumps and lifts, all heightened by the fact that they were executed only a few metres from the edge of the stage. In particular the final pas de deux of Snow White (Olga Pershankova) and her athletic Prince (Valdis Mintals) was dazzling and the Crow's (Alexei Kozlov's) spinning was dizzying.

Not only does this production treat you to virtuoso skating performances, it is also sprinkled with a number of extra thrills and excitements. Ekaterina Belokopitova's and Alexander Belokopitov's high rise antics on the trapeze had my heart in my mouth, and the gymnastic contortions of the Olympic gold medallist Ioulia Barsoukova were mind-boggling. However, what really made this production was the fact that the cast and choreographer managed to make the story genuinely interesting and the characters engaging. I heard someone describe the production as 'theatre on ice', and it really was. Giuseppe Arena's choreography made us sympathise with the characters and created wonderful comic moments as well as delivering technical delights, and my interest was sustained by the surprisingly good acting skills and comic timing of most of the cast. The scenes in the forest are particularly appealing, achieving the atmosphere of a comic silent movie, or the best sort of physical theatre.

Above all, the gazelle-like Snow White had the audience rooting for her from her earliest tap-dancing appearance as a child, to the elastic-faced and -bodied antics of her grown up incarnation, and Ekaterina Boki's and Sergei Smirnov's ducks pulled off the incredible feat of waddling gracefully on ice.

Unfortunately the incredibly high standards of choreography and performance were slightly marred by the poor quality of the reproduction of the music over loud speakers that produced occasional hisses and booms, and by costumes and sets that sometimes felt cobbled together. In particular the wicked witch Altea was dressed a little like a 70s roller disco queen, making an air of menace hard to pull off.

While these faults were minor they did little to dispel the impression of ice dancing as the poorer cousin of ballet. Overall this production offers an engaging and uplifting evening. The performers all exude an incredible good humour and delight in the performance, delight that seemed to be mirrored by the wideeyed and gasping children surrounding me. Indeed, despite being way past the age at which the Russian Ice Stars began to skate I left the theatre with a huge smile on my face and dreams of pirouetting into the arms of a handsome Prince in spangly white trousers.
