THEATRE REVIEW
Jungle Book
New Theatre, Oxford, Until Sat 8th July 2006.
The Birmingham Stage Company's highly successful musical swung into town bringing energy, new music and a great family night out. Originally a Christmas production, Jungle Book showed all the necessary panty-style elements: lovable characters in Mowgli, Bagheera and Baloo; a hissable badger in Shere Khan; audience participation and comedy monkeys! Graeme Messer's direction of Stuart Paterson's adaptation was well paced and showed the darker side of Mowgli's trials in both the jungle and the village most effectively. The songs by B.B. Cooper and Barf Jung kept the action moving along splendidly and were well choreographed by Kenn Oldfield. The finale evoked memories of The Lion King - not a criticism by any means - and the cast left the stage to a rousing cheer. Performances that really stood out in a very strong ensemble cast were Mark Holden as a lovable Baloo, Ben Redfern as Tabaghi the hilariously psychopathic jackal and henchman to Shere Khan - played in real pantio villain style by Peter F. Gardiner - Suzanne Ahmed as Kaa, the python (with a great singing voice and wonderfully serpentine movement); and the beautiful Hindu Buldeo excellently. King of the jungle, however, was Tony Hasnath as Mowgli. His energetic and enthusiastic playing really made the character live - a splendid performance in a cracking good show.

THEATRE REVIEW
Jungle Book
New Theatre, Oxford, Until Sat 8th July 2006.
The Birmingham Stage Company's highly successful musical swung into town bringing energy, new music and a great family night out. Originally a Christmas production, Jungle Book showed all the necessary panty-style elements: lovable characters in Mowgli, Bagheera and Baloo; a hissable badger in Shere Khan; audience participation and comedy monkeys! Graeme Messer's direction of Stuart Paterson's adaptation was well paced and showed the darker side of Mowgli's trials in both the jungle and the village most effectively. The songs by B.B. Cooper and Barf Jung kept the action moving along splendidly and were well choreographed by Kenn Oldfield. The finale evoked memories of The Lion King - not a criticism by any means - and the cast left the stage to a rousing cheer. Performances that really stood out in a very strong ensemble cast were Mark Holden as a lovable Baloo, Ben Redfern as Tabaghi the hilariously psychopathic jackal and henchman to Shere Khan - played in real pantio villain style by Peter F. Gardiner - Suzanne Ahmed as Kaa, the python (with a great singing voice and wonderfully serpentine movement); and the beautiful Hindu Buldeo excellently. King of the jungle, however, was Tony Hasnath as Mowgli. His energetic and enthusiastic playing really made the character live - a splendid performance in a cracking good show.
