THEATRE REVIEW
WIT
 @Burton Taylor Theatre until Sat 11th
 Vivien Bearing is a 50 year old academic who has dedicated her life to the study of the 17th century metaphysical poets. As the play opens, she is sitting on her hospital bed, her hair lost to the ravages of chemotherapy and her dignity lost to an ill-fitting hospital gown. With the onset of cancer, the professor who once dissected the poetry of John Donne, teasing out the precise meaning of every word and punctuation mark, has become an object of study in a world whose words she struggles to understand.

Producers Rory Platt and Olivia Uwehand came across **Wit** when part of the text was set for an exam and again, when studying the works of John Donne. For them, the play has a thematic relevance to people in an academic environment, such as Oxford. In the play, Vivien and medical researcher Jason Posner represent a world of dispassionate observation, analysis and intellectual rigour: the world of the mind. At the other end of the scale is Susie, Vivien's nurse, who represents sympathy and compassion when it's the middle of the night and you're scared and in pain: the world of the heart. As the play progresses, and Vivien approaches death, she moves towards the centre ground, where head and heart meet.
 Margaret Edson's Pulitzer Prize-winning **Wit** is an ambitious choice for a student group. The play runs for 90 minutes without an interval and the central character is on stage the whole
