A Midsummer Night's Dream, directed by Sophie Duncan, is simple, eloquent, and very funny. This production makes great use of its setting, the triple-arched stairway leading to Oriel's dining hall, and is perfect entertainment

Combining good delivery with striking visual humour, the play reinforces the comic aspect of this Shakespearean comedy, not always easy to achieve. Beyond the comic, this production deployed fire-twisting fairies and originally composed music, effecting a mysterious, illusory night in

A particularly impressive performance was given by Katie Edgerton, who plays Hippolyta and the beautifully flirtatious Titania. Cosima Gretton (Philostrate) also shone as the playful, mischievous Puck, dressed in all black, a delightful minister of the night. Karina Lickorish has great stage presence and a powerful delivery as the wearied, envious and anguished Helena. Not to be overlooked, the 'rude mechanicals' were hilarious, with an inspired Bottom (John-Mark Philo).

The play was brought to its close in a visually impressive way with each character blowing out a lantern in turn as Puck delivers his final lines. Not only did this help emphasise the enticing enigmas of the night, it also characterised the beautiful simplicity of this production. If you can get to Oriel this week, do so. This production should be enjoyed, especially on a summer's evening as it slips into nocturnal enchantment.


