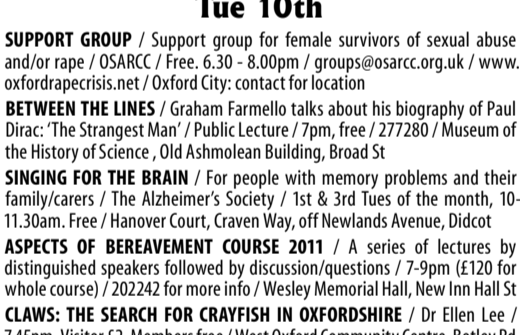
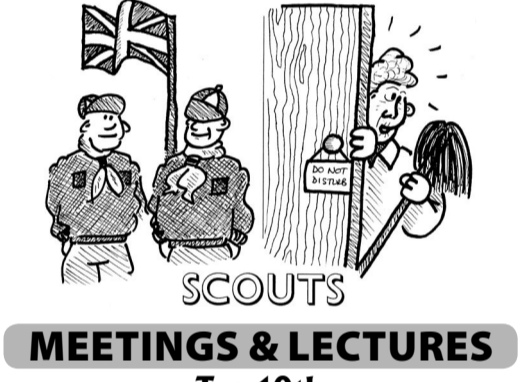
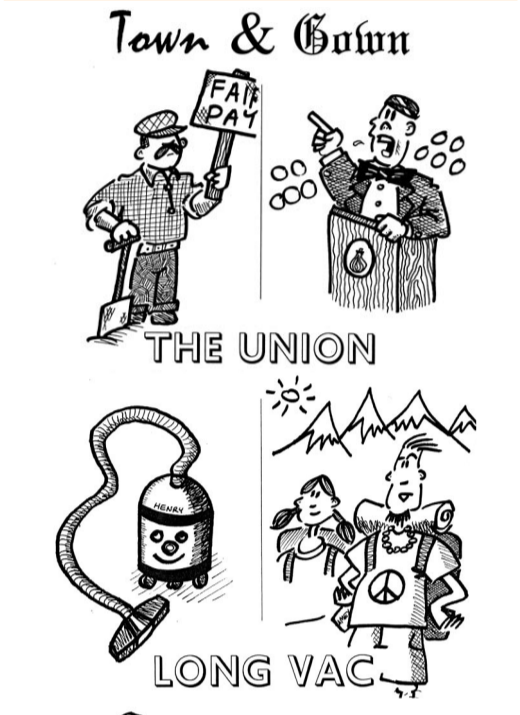

# FILM REVIEW

## THOR [12A]

This movie has so much going for it: stunning set design, witty script, gorgeous hero, even more gorgeous villain, pretty spiffy FX, some top-quality kick-ass combat sequences, quite a few laugh-out-loud funny moments and a fabulous supporting cast.

Why then does it fail to really touch the heart? Why do we not care all that much whether Thor (Chris Hemsworth) will manage to get it on with Jane (Natalie Portman), or see through the wiles of his naughty brother Loki (Tom Hiddleston), or gain an appreciation that the answer to all problems is not thwacking them to bits with his perfectly enormous hammer?

It is a vast and visually awesome spectacle, and it is funny, and I never thought I would find a hero with a full beard and upper arms wider than his head this attractive, but ultimately it's a bit 'Eeah' (not sure how you spell this word, perfected on Friends, which typically accompanies a shrug and indicates moderate indifference). It is fun though, and it is fabulous to look at.

Gravitas of a sort is brought by Stellan Skarsgård and Anthony Hopkins, and the Norse-nosity is all very nicely researched, as befits a project spearheaded by our own dear Ken (neth Branagh). Perhaps having emotional engagement with the characters is asking too much.

NB. For those as nerdily-minded as me who enjoy film trivia: the reason why Renée Russo's character is billed as Queen of Asgard and given no name is that her actual name in Norse mythology is Frigga (rhymes with snigger).

The film teems with corruption just as it does with acts of courage, sometimes in the same characters. I was so lost in it that I didn't notice how well acted and

filmed it was. I think that means it was outstanding as art - like Goya's 'Firing Squad'. Our political class should hang its head in shame.
