REVIEW: THEATRE

The Rivals, by R. B. Sheridan
Magdalen College President's Gardens until Saturday 12th

Richard Brinsley Sheridan's masterpiece
The Rivals is carried off with great élan in this
year's Magdalen Garden Show. The play of
1775 is a celebrated, boisterous satire of English
fashionable society. This may be a comedy of
manners, but Sheridan employs a range of humour
beyond polished drawing-room epigrams. In
the Bath of that period (where else?), a series
of strongly-drawn characters descend for the
Season and embark upon a tangled course of
love-affairs....

The energy of the cast fills this
production with life, and their enthusiasm
is infectious. Jean Meiring, appropriately
cast as one "somewhat long in the
tooth" gives us a convincingly
aged Sir Anthony, full of frenzied
delivery, effective stick-work
and a most distinctive laugh. I
also particularly enjoyed Paul
O'Mahony as Sir Lucius,
the Irish baronet-fallen-on-
hard-times, whose every
moment on the stage was
wonderfully funny -
even his entrances and
exits.

All the players,
in fact, turn in strong

performances, handling broad farce and tender
love scenes with equal aplomb. There is a
gratifying amount of that linguistic curiosity,
the Mummeret accent, in all its variants. Dominating
all, however, is Steven Barrett's Mrs. Malaprop.
He throws himself into this redoubtable female
role with gusto, and times to perfection all of the
(eponymous) mangled "particles of speech".

This production looks good too, with full
period dress, down to the very bustles. The
setting of the President's Garden at Magdalen
is delightful, and handily includes a terrace
which provides the perfect stage. Pacing is
very slick, and is eased by Mozart from a
string quartet. The first night audience
(which included a large pigeon)
proved highly appreciative in terms
of both laughter and applause;
in sum, Director Laura Murray
has fully achieved her aim
of "a summer evening of
light-hearted escapism".
In fact, clement weather
continuing, this might just
be the very model of an
Oxford garden show.
