Danny the Champion of the World Oxford Playhouse, to Sat June 14th. See Theatre listings, left.

This is a fun packed show with all the essential 'must haves' – a great story, a loveable main character, an evil villain and, of course, humour. From the outset the cleverly adapted stage version of Roald Dahl's classic Danny The Champion of The World captured the audience's attention with its pure energy and enthusiasm.

Gareth Warren brought to life the innocent and eager Damy, who discovers his dad's poaching secrets. An obvious hit with the excited audience, Gareth provided some excellent comedy momenta, delighting the children when he minicked other eccentric characters and giving regular chicken impressions! Spencer and the local village bobby, Sergeant Samways; 'h-well, h-well, h-what's going on 'ere then?"

The scenery and props, although minimal, were highly effective and I loved the pheasants The sceney and plots, and/org minima, were main encode and noted the pleasants and chickers - sepcially as they flew across the stage or field from the trees - fake feathers everywhere! Also, the music, performed by the cast either on stage or in the wings (what a talented bunch) added a great deal to the performance - highlighting the evil Mr. Hazel, adding tension and capturing the spirit of the scene in question.

Being a children's show, audience participation was always going to be on the cards, and despite hinting at it in the first half (bringing up the house lights to talk to characters sitting in the audience) we had to wait till the second half to stamp, clap and chere all at the same time. Although fitting in perfectly with the story line, it was a shame to keep the kids waiting so long; -when it came they lowed it, and the resulting sound level was unbelievable!

A thoroughly enjoyable evening for all the family. Perhaps Danny was a little old and maybe the audience participation a little late, but overall this was a great evening, fun for all the family! Vicky Hancock
