FILM REVIEW

Another Year by Mike Leigh

See it this week at the Odeon George St, and the Phoenix Picturehouse.

I'd seen previous films by Mike Leigh, so I knew vaguely what to expect: realism, English humour, accents and Jim Broadbent, which collectively lead up to a climax where at least one very earthy (literally in this film - there is an allotment!) and believable character stares into a dark abyss, while somehow, inconceivably, managing not to make you want to throw yourself off Magdalen Bridge on the way home.

The film is realistic in a fairly disconcerting way. Afterwards conversation felt strange, because Leigh had captured the way people talk to each other and presented it on a plate for us to laugh at, making me very aware of the potential ridiculousness of conversation when I tried to engage in one.

It's easy to care about the characters in the film, to feel involved in their lives and embarrassed by their frequent idiocies. Jim Broadbent somehow manages to exhibit the whole of his character Tom's personality in the action of folding up a shirt.

I had an emotional reaction to the story in general. Not crying all the way through - it wasn't that sort of film. But I cringed and shifted in my seat along with the characters on screen when inappropriate feelings and jealousies became obvious, and felt much calmer when more on-top-of-it characters had control of the situation.

For a film that is essentially dealing with the themes of loneliness and where bad luck and randomness can lead you, it was a very entertaining evening with a surprising number of laughs. *Another Year* is simultaneously fun and weirdly scary in a non-zombie way. I recommend it.
