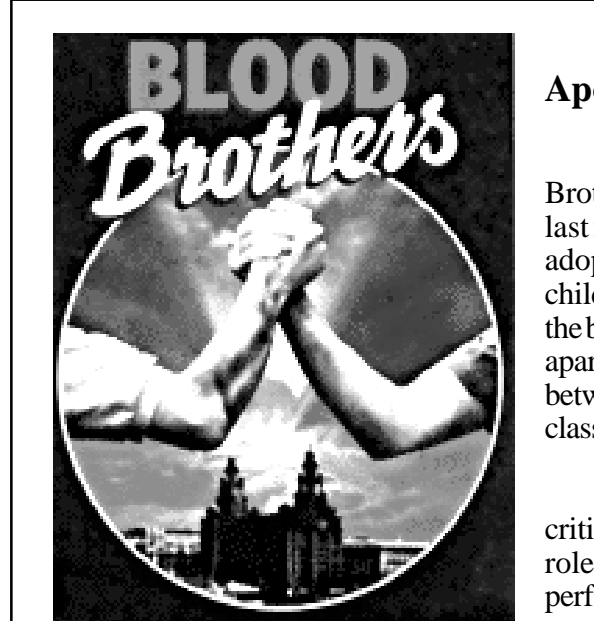

THEATRE REVIEW



Apollo Theatre until Sat 17th
The performance of Willy Russell's first musical Blood Brothers culminated with a standing ovation at the Apollo last night. This musical story of love, hate, sex, class and adoption has it all. A mother gives up her one of her twin children to provide him with a better life, and this tale plots the brothers' respective paths through life. Although raised apart they continue to meet throughout and the comparison between them highlights the divisions caused by money and class.

As a scouser myself I watched the production with a critical eye to accent. Linda Nolan, playing the substantial role of the mother, gave an excellent sung and spoken performance, although her accent slipped slightly when she was belting out a tune. Other performances by the cast both as children and, later, as the adults they grow into, were both convincing and entertaining. The roles of Micky and Linda were particularly well played by Chris Lemmon and Rebecca Reaney.

Willy Russell knows his subject. This musical accurately and painfully reflects the problems of the decline of industry in the north, of large families and of single parenthood, and graphically portrays the hardship experienced by those living in a society without contraceptives or hope. Whilst I find that the unremitting grimness in many portrayals of 'up north' can begin to grate, this musical was both entertaining and thought provoking. Willy Russell's familiarity with Liverpool and his compassion for its people means, that despite the despair of the human condition portrayed, you leave this performance uplifted by the production. The music, the actors, the set and the story combine to provide an engaging experience, although one that at the end is tinged with sadness.
