Site statistics for Dailyinfo.co.uk over a 3-day period (Sun 10th Aug, 00:00:00-Tues 12th Aug, 23:58:05):  
We had 10,605 visits, each of which was spread over an average of four pages, for a total of 41,844 pages viewed.

These visits were carried out by 6,173 'Unique Visitors', of whom 1,428 visited more than once. The average visit lasted just under 25 minutes. About 70% of people came directly to the site, & hence, we assume, were already aware of it. 20% arrived via various search engines, chiefly Google (10%). A further 10% got to the site by 'other' means, presumably links from other sites.

We get about twice as many visits on a weekday as on a Sunday. Dailyinfo readers are 'most active' between 12pm & 12.59pm (which is surprising given the temperature) & 'least active' between 5am & 5.59am. We have more visitors between 4pm & 4.59, but they don't do so much, having fallen into a mid-afternoon torpor. Nearly 60% of our visitors come from commercial domains & 25% from educational domains. At the other end of the scale we had 197 visits from government domains, & 20 from military sources. You are being watched. Now they know when you're most active, too.

Most people use a computer to visit the site, but we have had exactly 2 WAP visits, from an 'unknown wireless device'. If this was you, please tell us how it went.
