OXFRINGE REVIEW
Small Space
 Site-specific show about intimacy performed by a husband & wife in a domestic kitchen.
 Meet outside Oxford Playhouse, Beaumont Street to be escorted to secret venue.
 Fri 10th - Sat June 18th 2011 - Part of Oxfringe 2011

A very small group of us meet at The Playhouse to be 'escorted to a secret location'. This turns out to be only round the corner, but is nonetheless an unexpected delight. This touring play is set and performed in real-life kitchens, and has played in Brighton, Edinburgh and elsewhere. With an audience, the place is cramped, but this creates an almost voyeuristic intimacy with the two actors that makes the play such a special and unusual experience.
 Without wishing to reveal too much about any of the wonderfully-performed sequences, the piece hinges on a series of anecdotes delivered by this real-life married couple. Some enactments clearly represent the couple's alternate realities, so we can never be quite sure what is objectively true. However, the production isn't self-indulgently tricky or humourless - it has a freshness, a sense of fun, and an honesty that reveals both the frustrations and rewards of a marriage.
 For the audience, it really feels as though this couple are enjoying our company, confiding in us, and relishing the opportunity to reminisce on their marriage and shared adventures. They run around with energy and exuberance - but thankfully in such a tiny space, there is no audience participation!

Perhaps the central theme of this dialogue is about storytelling, and how we recollect and recount our experiences. The truth gets tangled, either through time, being ever more elaborated with inaccuracies, or with the biased perspective of the person telling the story. The discrepancies are mined for comic effect as we compare their two accounts.
 In terms of production, the illusion is achieved almost entirely through physical performance - after all, this is just an ordinary kitchen, although the couple also occupy other rooms in the house, leaving dialogue trailing as we remain kitchen-bound. There's basic lighting, a little dance, and music used sparingly and well. But it is by the actors' own efforts that we are transported, with occasional cracks in reality - a use of artifice that nicely skews the domesticity.
 This is a thoroughly enjoyable piece that brilliantly plays on the idea of art imitating life.
