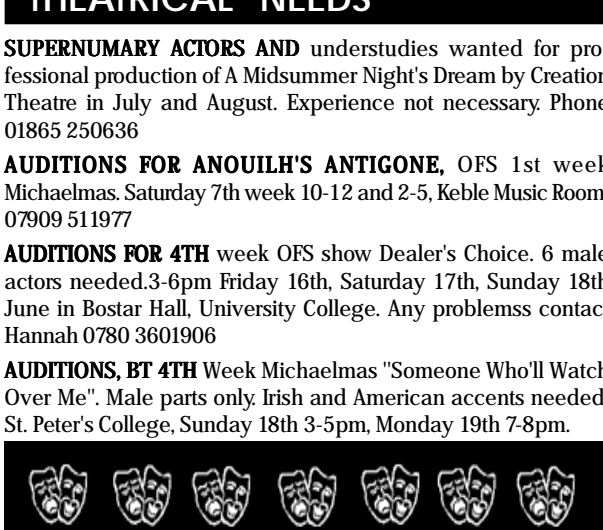

THEATRE REVIEW

Blood Wedding, by Lorca
Pegasus Theatre, 15th and 16th June

Lorca's intense play of passion and revenge has been called pure poetry. It takes a brave director to alter such a play, especially to cut it. But that is what the directors of this production have done, presumably to make it a more competition-like piece. The cast, talented spotted from various local schools, are representing Oxfordshire in the 12th European Youth Theatre Festival in Grenoble. Judging from this warm-up night in the Pegasus we should all be booking flights to the south of France right now.

Both directors are drama teachers and it shows. They have experimented with a new method of working with actors: the Whelan Tape Technique. This involves the actors' recording the script onto tape in the first instance. This is then played back for the actors to add gestures and movement. It is meant to be an effortless way to learn lines, and a means of producing actor-led, seamless performances. Anyone interested will find more information about this technique on the website: www.jeremy-whelan-acting.com.

Does the play survive such innovation? Wouldn't we lose the classical plotting, the tight structure, the pure poetry? I was worried at first, but need not have been. The central characters are presented strongly in all their doom and anguish. Called simply The Bridegroom, The Bridegroom's Mother, The Neighbour, etc. it is as if we have met them all before. Lorca seems to be saying that these people are never going to change. Only the wayward, lust- and love-driven peasant who steals the bride on her wedding day has a name - Leonardo - for us to remember him by. The new acting method emphasises the play's archetypes; we seem to be watching characters not only of flesh and blood but of bone and star and moon.

Talking of which, there is an amazing Moon in this play: a camp, degenerate, bloodthirsty kind of moon. He partners an equally well-played rendition of Death in a manic plot to kill the lovers. The flowing, dance-like acting comes into its own in the second half. As the lines become more poetic the play's underlying surrealism comes to the surface. With lines like "Their eyes like crushed flowers" in a play strewn with fallen petals, you start to realise how *Blood Wedding* might have been called pure poetry. I hoped for more but had to make do with just an amazing hour and ten minutes. The sound track was fabulous too. Oxfordshire should stand a very good chance in Grenoble. Fingers crossed.
