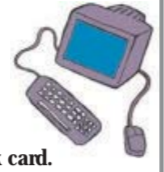

MUSIC REVIEW

OXFORD PUNT

Now in its 7th year, the Oxford Punt gives local unsigned artists the opportunity to show how great the city is as a breeding ground for up and coming talent.

Kicking off at Borders is Richard Walters, the first of the 19 acts appearing tonight. A crowd has gathered inside to witness the performance, which is being tipped as one of the hottest tickets of the night. We are not let down. One thing is clear: Richard Walters is going to be a star. He is gifted with a naturally melodic voice and absolutely oozes character. His band creates a nicely textured sound that has me thinking of a folkier Coldplay; they certainly have the potential to be as big.

The Relationships, a wickedly tight 3-piece are up next, fronted by ex-Anyways singer, Richard Ramage. They play jangly guitar pop in the vein of, well, The Anyways actually. And why not? They were a damn fine band. Ramage's wry, self-effacing humour has me smiling throughout. He should be given his own TV series. BBC 2 on a Friday night perhaps?

Off to Jongleurs next for Sexy Breakfast. Too late: They're already gone. X-Hail are on-stage and are fronted by, arguably, the most powerful voice in Oxfordshire. She certainly can belt it out. I'm not really one for this kind of bluesy AOR but it does have its moments.

Next I dash over to the Jam Factory for DaysOfGrace. The venue is weird. The stage is at the wrong end of the room and the band has to play behind a wooden rail. Very restraining one would have thought. But DaysOfGrace totally ROCK! The singer leaps around like a demented teenager (which he probably is) and it's a good job they have the barrier or we'd be in trouble. They create an unholy racket. Emocore? Hardcore? Who cares! They are noisy and fab.

I catch the tail end of Bridge back at Jongleurs, who are a folk-rock band and that's fine by me. They have a bouncy feel to them and would be well suited to summer festival-type situations. In true folk tradition they look awful: the keyboard player wears a cowboy hat. But you know what? They do what they do very well indeed. The last song in particular sets toes tapping and has a nicely grungy guitar keeping it together.

Back to the Jam Factory... Lord Almighty. The walls are shaking and from the toilet I can hear what sounds like several planes taking off. It's possibly the bloke in the next cubicle. No. It's Gunbunny who are even louder than DaysOfGrace, which is a remarkable achievement. They are a 3-piece but sound like they have about 17 guitars apiece. Any self-respecting man would run screaming at this point. Luckily, I have no self-respect so I hang around until my ears bleed and I start to foam at the mouth. Gunbunny are an awesome blend of Motorhead, Deep Purple (In Rock) and Napalm Death. They are truly great and are the future of British Rock. They have the best chorus of the night in "Son of a bitch!"

Finally the bear takes hold of me and, being lame and old, I decide it's time to leave. My ears are ringing, my knees and back are aching and bed is calling. It's only just gone 11 but I call it a night. Maybe next year I'll make it to more venues and stick it out to the end. Maybe. (Rock and) Roll on 2004!

Magdalen Players present My Fair Lady

President's Gardens, Magdalen College
Third Week (until Sat 17th)

For those not acquainted with this play, it can be briefly summarised by reiterating Professor Higgins instructions to Eliza, a lowly cockney barrowgirl:



"You are to stay here for the next six months learning to speak beautifully, like a lady in a florist's shop. At the end of six months, you will be taken to an embassy ball in a carriage, beautifully dressed. If the king finds out you are not a lady, you will be taken to the Tower of London, where your head will be cut off as a warning to other presumptuous flower girls! If you are not found out, you shall be given a present of seven-and-sixpence to start life with in a lady's shop."

The production team and directors set themselves an ambitious task when embracing 'My Fair Lady'. The play's witty dialogue and stunning characterisations - not to mention the complex class and gender relationship that calls middle class morality into question - draws on the skill of all the participants. The Magdalen Players bravely faced the challenge and succeeded.

The play demands of the cast the ability to simultaneously dance, sing and act. Although getting off to a slightly rocky start, the cast soon synchronized their efforts and produced a respectable, humorous and enjoyable production. Eliza (Rachel Parris) and Professor Higgins (Gabriel Vick) worked extremely well together and successfully conveyed their changing attitudes towards each other during the play as Eliza learned to 'speak proper' and the Professor learned to act like a gent. More importantly, they retained their dual identities, Eliza maintaining her independent nature in respect to her dreams whilst Higgins continued to scorn society whilst warming up the audience's heart-sockles as the romance continued. Ferdinand Koenig (Alfred Doolittle) gave us a charismatic portrayal of the carefree working class dustman, contrasting nicely with that of Colonel Pickering (Benjamin Smyth) who, although willing to place the bet that stimulates Eliza's education, frets about the consequences upon her person throughout the play.

The production was also considerably enhanced by its accompaniment. The combination of live strings, brass and piano brought out not only the romantic nature of the characters but also the more comical aspects of their personas. Adrian Briggs, the first violinist, in particular brought authority to the play, and was a joy to the ear. The chorus too was extremely talented, each member having moments of excellence throughout the play and working together to form a strong support. Stepping out of the chorus, three voices were distinctive, namely the two housemaids (Genevieve de la Bat Smit & Olivia Macdonald) and Freddy (Rónan Busfield).

Finally, congratulations should be given to the back-stage crew, who created a perfect environment for the characters to develop. In any case, the President's Garden provides an excellent setting, echoing the unspoken romance and underlying beauty found within all lifestyles expressed in the play. First-time outdoor show attendees please note: this evening, shawl and gloves would have been entirely appropriate.
