THEATRE PREVIEW

THE SORCERER, by Gilbert and Sullivan Holywell Music Room, Saturday 25th and Sunday 26th

Sir Arthur S. Sullivan,

Today sees the hundredth anniversary of the death of one of the best-loved and most influential English composers of recent times. Sir Arthur Sullivan. His passing, in November 1900, very much heralded the end of the Victorian era; for his music both epitomised and helped to fashion the Britain of Victoria's reign. Its comfortable pomposity, coupled with light-hearted but always entirely respectable frivolity captures perfectly the self-confident, genteel spirit of a nation at the height of her industrial and imperial powers. Sullivan was also a very influential figure in many

spheres of society; there was rarely an important music festival or state occasion for which he was not asked to compose a new work. But perhaps his greatest influence came through his collaboration with the librettist W.S. Gilbert, a collaboration that produced such perennially popular masterpieces as *The Pirates* of Penzance, The Mikado, and the rest of the so-called Savoy Operas. These brought Sullivan's gift for melody before a wider audience: his wonderful tunes were hummed and whistled incessantly by aristocrat and working man alike; the yearly unveiling of each new Savoy Opera was, in all sections of society, one of the most eagerly awaited events of the summer; and through skilful setting of Gilbert's subtle national

satire, Sullivan helped to shape Victorian Britain's national consciousness. Within months of the composer's death, Queen Victoria herself passed away, finally bringing to a close one of the greatest chapters in British history.

It is hard, then, to think of a more appropriate time to perform one of Sullivan's best-loved works. This weekend, at the Holywell Music Room, Oxford University's Gilbert and Sullivan Society present The Sorcerer, a work full of the glittering melodies and coruscating wit for which the pair are justly famous. Their first full-length collaboration, it

shows Sullivan at his most carefree and ebullient: the joyous light-heartedness of the tea-party brindisi; the soaring melodies he sets to the tenor lead' somewhat spurious moralising; and the skilfully handled, dazzlingly fast act II quintet all rank among As far as the libretto is concerned, The

Sorcerer is one of Gilbert's most amusing conceits: at the behest of a well-meaning but thoroughly misguided patrician, a professional sorcerer administers a love-potion to an entire village. The consequences are inevitable but

nonetheless hilarious: the jokes come thick and fast as the inhabitants of the village form passionate, and entirely unsuitable, attachments to each other. In J.W. Wells, the jolly

cockney, and endearingly tradesman-like family Sorcerer. Gilbert created one of his most enduringly popular characters. The part is taken in this new production by Gilbert and Sullivan veteran Jordan Bell, who captivated audiences with his rendition of the role in the Society's acclaimed 1997 performance in Buxton Opera House. He is joined by a talented new cast, including two singers imported from Christ Church cathedral choir. The Holywell


