OPERA REVIEW

Die Fledermaus
Welsh National Opera
The Apollo Oxford, 24th October

The tale of a wealthy man sent to jail for taking government information on the stock market, being treated preferentially, but complaining about how badly done by he is. Die Fledermaus begins with an all too familiar story. They could hardly let it go by without referring to Jeffrey Archer - "Prison's not so bad these days. I hear it doesn't even stop you from going to parties!" quips the doctor.

It was the up to date references and the fast-paced dialogue, which may have surprised some opera-goers but which gave the production its momentum. Together with the superb quality of music one would expect from the WNO, this made for a rich, sumptuous, decadent experience.

Of course, the tale has its dark side, shown particularly skilfully as partying turns into hangover. "Shuttup" come the cries as one sole voice keeps singing. The heady mix of dancing, alcohol and sex is all built on hypocrisy and lies: the opera's conclusion satisfies its two-faced characters - they can live with the deceit, so long as they have champagne to blame it on.
