

Indiana Jones & the Kingdom of the Crystal Skull [12A]

A bad, sad attempt at recapturing a successful and on the whole rather enjoyable Hollwood formula. The dialogue is so pedestrian it leaves you wondering what on earth Lucas and his co-writers were thinking about. There deprecation of old and the actors are left to fend for themselves, looking wooden and ill at ease with their roles. The lines are delivered straight with no sign of the ironic winkle "Indie" fans will remember fondly and Harrison Ford appears almost robotic in his portrayal of one of Hollywood's best anti-hero creations. Even Cate Blanchett does not manage to salvage this sinking ship, as her character is so clichéd as to be hammy.



The first gardener was a retired German soldier, Jacob Bobart, who was delighted to find that the cess-pits of the colleges provided him with almost unlimited supplies of good growing medium.

He was a powerfully built man, who late in life sported a beard of such length that one day a madman grabbed hold of it and cried out that Bobart had eaten his horse, and its tail was hanging of his mouth. Bobart was succeeded by his son, who became Professor of Botany. Around 1700, the Younger Bobart discovered a rat in the garden, and by cosmetic surgery turned it into

yaruen, and by cosmetic surgery turned it into so convincing a dragon that great excitement was caused in the academic world. The hoaxer eventually confessed, but the 'dragon' was considered such a masterpiece anyway, that it was kept on display in the School of Anatomy. Robart the Elder built a conservatory whe the greenhouses now stand; this was probably one of the first in England. Since then the greenhouses by then the greenhouses have been rebuilt several times. They are a treasure-trove of exotic plants. It is worth remembering that though the gardens are open 9am-6pm in summer, you can only visit the greenhouses between 10am and 5.30pm.
