The show is intensely personal which, paradoxical though it may sound, is a very effective tactic for driving home the central message of the piece: that terrorism is not at all personal any of us could have been a terrorist, had we be born in a different time, place, or situation, and all of these witnesses are human beings, just like us.

The performance begins almost imperceptibly, with an extremely slow fade and fan actors address the audience with their stories with such directness, honesty and op rivileged to have such confidence bestowed upon you.


Indeed, the production's greatest asset is its candour and the uniformly stunning cast and sensitive direction thy of much prior because and the second sec the veracity of the message of the piece: the difference between us and terrorists is not that great.

The genre is successfully exploited and fully justified through the use of techniques such as narratorial tervention, undefined spaces, theatrical transitions between scenes, and certain chunks of past events being acted as opposed to simply recouncil. The writing is well shaped for the theatre, and the monologues of the tresses are interlocked with vibrancy as well as sensitivity, keeping the audience fully engaged: sometimes links tween the withresser justaposed monologues are immediately obvious, sometimes initially boxarce sometimes eyemerge gradually, and sometimes they become clear in a sudden flash. Humour also has an importantrole and manipulated in a sublimely suble and closel-observed way; it is not used as a barrier to sity away from advacues. ues, nor does it trivialize the subject, but just the right dosage is injected at appropriate mo ients so as to preven the audience closing up and to allow them to remain engaged throughout the more horrific passages
