OXCOELIACS

People with coeliac disease suffer immune reactions to gluten - found in wheat, barley, and rye - and quietly stuffed into almost every processed foodstuff you can buy. People without coeliac disease can suffer similar reactions to gluten or wheat, and some people avoid gluten due to perceived health benefits.
 Jen Pawsey works for Daily Info, and has some advice about living without gluten in Oxford:

I would not wish a gluten allergy on anyone. And to have to stop eating wheat suddenly makes you realise how much most countries depend on it. But it will make you try all sorts of things you've never eaten before, and it'll make you understand how cooking works a lot better, and I can't imagine what it would be like to be 'normal' anymore! You'll learn a lot about different cultures, and world cuisines: it's a great excuse to eat an awful lot of Indian food! Just don't try and count up the hours you spend reading labels...

Variety is the spice of life! If you're susceptible to becoming allergic to things don't feed your body too much of any one substance. Living off soya milk, soya flour bread, edamame and soya sauce is a recipe for disaster. If you're eating commercial gf bread, check what's in it and try to balance things out. If you eat a lot of rice, try pasta that's 100% maize.
 Do bother finding out about food on menu. Health is more important than embarrassment. I say this knowing full well I'm very bad at convincing myself of it. Be prepared if possible - try to find out about food before you go out somewhere, and carry snacks with you when travelling. You're most likely to break your diet when you're tired and hungry.

 Watch out for traps! For example:
 • French fries are often dusted with flour to make them crispier.
 • Both mayonnaise and baked beans can contain wheat, as do most sauces (to thicken them).
 • Sausages may contain wheat rusk.
 • Soya sauce, sweet & sour dishes, spring roll pastry, & some plain crackers all have gluten in them. Chinese/Japanese cuisine can be a pain in the stomach...

JoVanessa reviews one helpful restaurant for coeliacs:
 On Friday night I visited Cafe Coco on the Cowley Road. First time I'd eaten out since being diagnosed as a coeliac. I took my dietitian's advice - and called first.
 Top marks to Cafe Coco: they knew about Gluten Free (GF) diets, advised on menu items that were GF and (despite it not being policy on a Friday night) reserved us a table for four people.
 It was just as good when we arrived: a table waiting, more menu items highlighted and a lack of fuss and worry (which meant I didn't feel like a troublemaker).
 At least one in a hundred people is a coeliac and many more are now avoiding gluten for health reasons. If you're planning on a visit: suitable items include Greek salad, salmon salad, garlic potatoes and prawns.
