**CINEMA REVIEW**

**Hannibal Rising [18]**

Odeon George Street: Mon 19 - Thu 22: 5.00, 8.00pm; Vue Cinema: Mon 19 - Thu 22: 2.40, 5.20, 8.15pm.

If you have ever wondered what could possibly have happened to start a man on a path which would eventually lead to such acts as killing a cellist to improve the sound of his favourite orchestra, then this is the film for you. Whilst not like the other films featuring Hannibal Lecter, in that this is a straight narrative rather than a crime mystery, it is nonetheless a satisfying tale of the eponymous Doctor's youth, and exactly what it was that caused his extended killing spree. Most of the cast are not well known, there are a few familiar faces, but it is the story which carries the film rather than any particular star. There is plenty of gore and violence, as one would expect, and in my opinion Hannibal's last line is at least as good as the classic "I'm having an old friend for dinner" at the end of *Silence of the Lambs*. Having said all that, if you want more depth, read the book, which fills in the gaps which the film necessarily leaves out in favour of narrative flow.
